MAIZYALET VELÁZQUEZ

Maizyalet Velázquez, a native of Puerto Rico, began her training at Ballet Concierto de Puerto Rico training in both the conservatory and company. She graduated from the Virginia School of the Arts in 2007, where she studied under David Keener and the late Petrus Bosman.

He attended the University of Cincinnati College Conservatory of Music and graduated in May 2015 when he joined Cincinnati Ballet Second Company. In 2016 he was

promoted into the company and has danced in a world premiere by Ma Cong, Minus 16 by Ohad Naharin, debuted the role of Zeus in the North American premier of Annabelle Lopez Ochoa's Eros Redux, the title role in Nicolo Fonte's world premiere of Carmina Burana, Justin Peck's Murder Ballads, Jiri Kylian's Sechs Tänze, and works by Victoria Morgan, Devon Carney, Adam Hougland, Kate Weare and Septime Webre.



DANIEL BENAVIDES

Janiel Benavides grew up dancing traditional Mexican folk dance ballet folklórico, and began his ballet training through the STEP-UP! program at Anaheim Ballet where he received a full tuition scholarship in his second year. Within his first two years of ballet training, he was accepted to summer intensives at both American Ballet Theatre and San Francisco Ballet. He joined the San Francisco Ballet School in 2002 on

full scholarship. After two years training and performing with San Francisco Ballet, he moved to Boston to begin his professional career with Boston Ballet II. In 2006, he had the opportunity to tour with The Suzanne Farrell Ballet, performing in Scotland at the Edinburgh International Festival, a world-renowned venue for artists from across the globe. Benavides danced with Orlando Ballet for fifteen seasons, performing roles such as The Cavalier and Drosselmeyer in *The Nutcracker*, Tybalt in *Romeo and Juliet*, Von Rothbart in *Swan Lake*, The Beast in *Beauty and the Beast*, Birbanto in *Le Corsaire*, and the title role in *Dracula*. He has worked with many notable choreographers, including Twyla Tharp, Jessica Lang, Lila York, Peter Chu, Bruce Marks, Michael Pink, and Robert Hill.
